NAPLAN Reports for 2019

The school has received copies of the NAPLAN individual and additional student reports for 2019 from the NSW Education Standards Authority. NAPLAN report envelopes for year 3 and year 5 are being sent home with all students this week prior to the expected deadline of Friday 27 September. The envelopes also contain a letter to parents and caregivers.

All staff will be reviewing these results as part of professional learning early in term 4. NAPLAN results are an important part of the assessment data that the school collects, in addition to data already collected in the school from classroom based assessments and teacher observations of students. The NAPLAN assessment provides guidance for discussions along with other information to look at strengths and areas of need within our school to focus upon. These results are also important feedback for families. Please review the results as a family. If you have any questions please see your classroom teacher.
