Updated School Information Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) from 1 March 2020

The NSW Department of Education is working closely with the NSW Ministry of Health in response to the unfolding international COVID-19 (formerly referred to as Novel Coronavirus) situation.

Further travel restriction

Effective 1 March 2020 the Federal Government has issued a travel ban on foreigners coming to Australia from Iran. Only

Address: PO Box W3489, 65 Bridge Street WEST TAMWORTH NSW 2340 Telephone: 02 6765 8316 Facsimile: 02 6762 1226 Email: tamworthw-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au Web: www.tamworthw-p.schools.nsw.edu.au Australian citizens and permanent residents coming from Iran will be allowed entry to Australia, and from 1 March they are required to self-isolate for a period of 14 days after departing Iran consistent with the restrictions for those entering from China. Additionally, Australians have been advised NOT to travel to Iran.

Updated advice from the NSW Government for parents and affected staff regarding COVID -19 is:

- Any student or staff member who has been in, or transited through, mainland China (not just Hubei province) or has been in Iran is excluded from work, school or child care services for 14 days from the date they left mainland China or Iran (as the COVID-19 incubation period can be as long as two weeks).
- Any confirmed case of COVID-19 will be excluded until they are medically cleared to return.
- Close contacts of a confirmed case of COVID-19 will be excluded for 14 days since last contact with the confirmed case.
- Students and staff who have returned to Australia from mainland China or Iran more than 14 days ago and have shown no symptoms are able to return to school.

The NSW Ministry of Health has processes to identify any close contacts of cases confirmed in Australia. Advice about not attending school would be provided to these close contacts by the NSW Ministry of Health.

Consistent with current guidelines, students who are unwell with respiratory illness should remain at home until symptoms resolve. In accordance with the NSW Department of Education's current practice, if any student becomes unwell, the school will implement infection control guidelines and follow the advice provided by the NSW Ministry of Health as appropriate.

Maintaining good hygiene standards is an important way to reduce the risk of acquiring and spreading respiratory infections. Parents and caregivers are asked to promote good hygiene, including handwashing with soap as <u>handwashing</u> is the single most effective way to reduce the spread of germs that cause respiratory disease.

The NSW Ministry of Health has advice and resources about COVID-19 in English and Chinese.

The NSW Department of Education will continue monitoring the COVID-19 situation and provide parents and caregivers with updated information about the virus.

Road Safety

As mentioned in the previous newsletter the school is working with community groups, council and local police to improve safety for children, families and community around our school. This is in response to an increase in unsafe traffic movement and parking each afternoon between 2:50pm and 3:45pm around the school and in particular Church Street out the front of St Paul's church, around the Church Street crossing area and the Church Street bus zone.

The school executive met with a Tamworth Regional Council officer on site and the areas of most concern were inappropriate parking and driving which included parking on the sidewalk out the front of St Paul's church, crossing the road in high traffic areas and bus zones and parking on private property at the front of St Paul's church.

In response the school are working with council and council have advised the following.

Rangers have been attending the site more frequently following the recent site visit. This has been to assist with education. If necessary, rangers will be issuing infringements during their next visits.

- The offence for parking on a foot path/strip in built up area is \$268 and no demerit points.
- The offence for parking on a foot path/strip in a school zone is \$344 and 2 demerit points
- The school works with council to educate families on parking rules.

- A driver must not stop for more than two minutes.
- You must remain in or within three metres of the vehicle.

It was observed that William Street at the back of the school is underutilised for parking and there are multiple spaces. Parents can park here at the end of the day so long as they adhere to the guidelines.

There are further recommendations that the school will be working with council and the Roads and Maritime Services to improve safe traffic flow around the school for children, families and community. We appreciate your support in this matter and look forward to seeing an improvement in road safety from all of our families.

Special Religious Education (Scripture)

The Education Act 1990 states 'in every government school, time is to be allowed for the religious education of children of any religious persuasion'. Special education in ethics can be offered as a secular alternative to special religious education.

SRE is organised and delivered in schools by negotiation and agreement between the principal and the approved providers. SRE commenced last Thursday at Tamworth West PS from 9:30am—10:00am and runs each Thursday of the year. We have providers who organise authorised representatives in SRE : Catholic and SRE: Combined Christian. Information regarding SRE arrangements at Tamworth West are available on the school website along with a letter for use if you have not made a selection for your child.

During SRE time the school also offers alternative meaningful activities for those students whose families do not wish them to take part in Special Religious Education. At this time there are still a number of students whose families did not make a choice on their enrolment form. A note has been sent home for all children. Please complete this and return to school. From week 7 families of students will be contacted to finalise this choice.

Voluntary Student Activities of a Religious Nature in Schools (VSA) (SUPA club)

Voluntary student activities of a religious nature in schools (VSA) are not part of Special Religious Education (SRE) but may operate under the auspices and supervision of the principal. Tamworth West PS offers a Scripture Union Primary Age Club for students in yrs 4, 5 and 6 during recess on a Thursday for students who want to come and have returned a completed permission note. This is run by authorised representatives and supervised by school staff. If you wish your child to attend please send them to Mr Scarborough for a note.

Weekly Tip—Behaviour and expectations


Creating clear expectations, routines, and consistency means kids are able to predict the kind of behaviour that's acceptable.

Remember, it takes time and practice to understand and learn new routines - but here are some tips to help.

- Children need and want boundaries. Like any relationship, the best way to do this is through communication. Let your child know what is going to happen and what you expect from them. The key points of boundary creation are: set the routine, give them notice, be predictable, and be consistent.
- Schools use signals (e.g. a bell) to indicate when they need children to stop an activity, or change focus. You could make your own sound signal. As an example, when it's nearly time to leave the park, communicate and set the expectation. Let your child know they have 5 minutes left and get them involved by allowing them to help you set a timer on your phone or watch. This way, they will know what the alarm means and expect to change their focus when they hear it.







Effective Classroom Organisation

Instructional Leaders have been working classroom teachers on effective classroom organisation. It is important that children know goals and expectations in the school, home and other environments so they can focus on the main task at hand. Whether that be learning at school both social and academic or at home with household jobs and duties or being in the community.

In a work environment where multiple conflicting demands can make everything seem equally important, goals establish what is relatively more or less important and focus staff and student attention and effort accordingly (Robinson, 2017) Teachers at Tamworth West have been focusing on ensuring that clear and consistent class routines are established early and now in place so that students can focus on learning and teachers on teaching. The schools Positive Behaviour for Learning program is a whole school and

community focus. Teachers have developed their classroom agreements under our expectation areas of Respect, Resilience and Responsibility. Families can work to support the school by including this same language in their routines and agreements at home. Children respond to knowing routines in both the school and home environment. It is really important to talk with children about these as a family. These agreements or family values can then be displayed in a visual format such as a list or a table which helps children to understand what is expected of them and what is coming.

Each school community is unique and will have its own learning, social and behaviour challenges. A whole school approach supports everyone in the school community to develop the same understandings, language, practices and strategies. It requires consistency across the school environment from all staff.

A whole school approach provides the opportunities for all students to learn and practice the expected behaviours and routines. There are some groups and individuals who will require additional teaching, practice, support and reinforcement. Students might move into and out of the need for additional support at different stages and for different skill areas and challenges (Online Training Australia)

At this weeks staff professional learning meeting we discussed Personal Learning Pathways and began the

consultation process to develop the Tamworth West PS model. An effective PLP should:

- \Rightarrow include a literacy and numeracy component for all students who are at risk of falling behind.
- \Rightarrow articulate learning pathways required to pursue the student's identified goals


